This year I am incredibly grateful that God has given me the staff we have. As our ministry assistant, Scott is so even-keeled and regularly puts in far more time than he should, often on extra projects he has been given that are not necessarily a part of his role. If I am taking a day off, my children are devastated if they cannot be a part of our children's ministry, either as a junior leader or a part of the program. I am so glad to see that Yvonne has built a strong group of junior leaders. My long-term vision is to see people built up and sent out for my mission and ministry. I believe that starts with empowering and equipping even the youngest to lead, giving our people opportunities to step up and explore the wonderful opportunities of discipling each other.





Justin has been another God send for Mosaic. As Greg Cook and I discussed this role, I specifically wanted the role of Administrator to include someone who would develop relationships with, and proactively seek community engagement through the use of our building. In the short time Justin has been here, we have seen Justin go far above and beyond in seeking to do just that. The two days he works here in the office are just the

tip of the iceberg. Further, his expertise in finance and budgeting has been a massive blessing as we come to this budget meeting.

I have chosen to bring some highlights according to the current pillars of our vision.

Mosaic Church is loved, known, and celebrated by the local community.

- We will receive \$5000 early in the new year as a grant from Carinity for Mosaic Care. Helen and Justin have been working hard to ensure this much-needed ministry has continued and will be used strategically. Not to be a single-touch ministry, but a ministry that encourages those we meet into a relationship with Jesus.
- The Early Learning Centre sale has unfortunately remained slow in progress. But I have worked hard in the background to ensure the relationships with the Baptist Union have remained positive by regularly spending time at the head office in Brisbane.
- We were invited to be a part of the opening of the new Council offices at Firth Park. Councillor Glenn Tozer was incredibly thankful for our role in making the event a huge success. A massive thank you to Rami and the evangelism team for being there and to Yvonne, who organised us to be there.



• We were asked to host several regional church events this past year. This is significant for us as a church. I believe God placed us in such a central location and gave us this incredible facility to be more than a local church with local reach.

We are called and mandated to be a church that encourages and supports the churches around us. These are steps that will see us grow towards this goal.

- 1. Global Leadership Summit leadership networking event
- 2. City Impact round table, a gathering of Gold Coast Pastors who wish to grow the Christian church through unity
- 3. The Gold Coast Baptist Pastor's 2023 gathering, including Baptist Union leadership

Mosaic Church people are regularly sharing testimonies of God moving, both personally and as a faith community.

- This year we have had four baptisms, and each shared a moving testimony of God working in their lives.
- As a part of Alpha, we have had a number of people share about God's healing in their lives. Two completely unchurched people have been attending. A massive thank you to Gavin Grant and Justin Tye, who led Alpha this term.



Mosaic Church intentionally disciples all generations, people young and old.

- Alpha is the first step in my discipleship strategy, a strategy in which we will offer a number of discipleship courses aiming to lead people through the journey from finding Christ to being Christ-centred.
- We have added one life group here in 2022. We now have seven life groups that people can join.
- Volunteer Development has been a great encouragement.



- We regularly have one quarter or greater of those attending Sunday worship.
 25% of our church actively engaged in service and the vision of the church is excellent.
- We have seen team growth through people attending Volunteer Development.
- And we have seen leaders grow in confidence and skill in their roles.
- This year we had 14 attend the Global Leadership Summit. This was an increase in 100% from last year. And Global


Leadership Summit, in particular, Bronwyn Nance was so happy with how we ran the event that we have been asked to be a premier site for 2023, hosting churches and individuals from all over the Gold Coast late next year.

- Our monthly prayer night has seen increased engagement through 2022, regularly having 12 in the evenings. In particular, we have also seen a decrease in the average age of the prayer meeting. This is important for longevity.
- Our youth group have continued studying Romans throughout the latter part of this year. A massive thank you to Pete and Bec, who are doing an excellent job looking after our youth.
- Our Children's ministry also continues to grow, with regularly more than 30 involved in this vital ministry. Most encouraging to me has been seeing some of our upcoming leaders, like Claudia

and Cadence having the opportunity to learn through teaching. I believe the best way for someone to learn about anything is to do it!

Mosaic Church has grown significantly with new converts to Christ.

- We have seen three people give their lives to Christ in 2022. This
 alone should be a massive encouragement to us. I believe this is the
 chief aim of the church. And three decisions in a church our size is
 well above the Australian average.
- We have begun supporting Alan and Leanne Purvis, who are now in Cambodia and beginning their mission through building relationships and learning the Cambodian language.
- We are a church with overwhelming debt. And we could easily justify
 a decrease in missions giving. However, the council has approved a significant increase in our
 missions giving this coming year. On top of supporting Alan and Leanne, we will be supporting
 the Gideon's, Our Baptist Union movement, City Impact, ARK, Destiny Rescue, and Baptist
 World Aid. This coming year we will have a significant missions focus in May. This will be a part
 of a local missions focus for us as a church in term 2.
